- **What is the event about?**

The Bridge Partnership is the first point of contact for anyone in Salford who is worried about a child. Using a multi-agency approach, cases are screened and sent to the relevant teams to provide support for the family. There have been a lot of changes and pressures to all services recently, so this event has been arranged in order to give a briefing on how things stand now and to gather feedback on how things can be improved. We will be covering the following:

- What the Bridge is - its function and partners and their roles
- How to make a referral - information needed in the referral, what makes a good referral and what you should have done before referring in
- How to use The Bridge - information they may hold on a family or to pass on information
- Outcome of referrals and feedback to practitioners
- Services and projects involved in / linked to The Bridge

- **Who should attend?**

The sessions will be prioritised for front line practitioners and managers dealing directly with children and their families. However, we welcome other agencies and adult practitioners, to enable us to better work together
