- Disrupt and dismantle Organised Crime Groups involved in organised immigration crime;
- Safeguard the victims of immigration crime;
- Balanced approach to high harm volume crime;
- Maximise the opportunities to confiscate criminal assets

Our Vision




IE's vision is to create a robust person-centred approach, develop a widespread culture of understanding and support, and build safeguarding measures into all stages of immigration contact and decision-making.
