

Working Together to Safeguarding Children Virtual Training

Pre Covid, the SSCP provided **Basic Awareness** training for professionals <u>who</u> <u>may</u> come into contact with children, young people and families and the **Foundation** course for people <u>who work</u> with children, young people and families. As an interim measure whilst all face to face training is on hold due to current Covid restrictions, the SSCP have developed virtual training called **Working Together** which will replace the Basic and Foundation course.

Who should attend?

The Working Together course is open to all and will deliver key safeguarding messages all professionals essentially need if/when coming into contact with children, young people and families.

It is recommended that following the Working Together training, those professionals who require a greater depth of safeguarding knowledge also attend the **Multi-Agency Guest Speaker** training and any other additional relevant training.

Course aims:

- To consider the current context of Working Together to Safeguard Children
- To understand that each agency shares a common goal, and to reflect on your own responsibility
- To increase knowledge and understanding of legislation, policy, and procedure of safeguarding children
- To understand the importance of recording information, and how to make a referral
- To understand the impact of working with trauma on practitioners and the importance of self care
