Who should attend? Staff who work within the safeguarding system and who may be involved in recognising, assessing, and supporting children and families in cases of parental substance use.

This course is for staff who have experience of safeguarding and child protection work.

Course Objectives:

In this course participants will:

- Understand the risks to children and the impact on them when their parents/carers are drug and/or alcohol misusers
- Explore the needs of children with substance misusing parents and the factors which promote resilience and help to protect them
- Look at some of the research in this area, drawing on lessons from safeguarding/serious case reviews
- Explore the impact of discrimination
- Look at the impact of substances in pregnancy
- Explore ways of raising the issue of substance use with parents
- Understand why parents don't engage and what to do if they don't
- Know what support and treatment services exist locally
