Who should attend? Staff from all agencies who work with adults and children or young people

#### **Course aims:**

- 1. To develop participants' knowledge and understanding of domestic abuse
- 2. To understand the harm caused by domestic abuse
- 3. To raise awareness of potential indicators of domestic abuse and equip participants to ask where they suspect someone may be affected
- 4. To give people confidence to respond appropriately to disclosures of domestic abuse, including making referrals and signposting people to support

### **Course Objectives:**

Participants will be able to:

- Be aware of the definition of Domestic Abuse, including understanding the different forms of domestic abuse
- Understand the harm caused to victims and children
- Raise awareness of the indicators of different types of abuse
- Understand the role of selective enquiry where domestic abuse is suspected and the importance of doing this safely

- Understand different models used to explain domestic abuse, including the cycle of abuse, the Power and Control Wheel and Biderman
- Understand factors that may increase risk
- Be aware of the DASH assessment tool and MARAC process
- Have an understanding of safety planning
- Be aware of support services available for children, victims and perpetrators
