



Domestic Abuse – A Whole Family Approach Virtual Training

Duration: This training will be delivered over 2 half day sessions and participants **MUST** be available to attend **BOTH** sessions

Who should attend? Staff from all agencies who work with children, young people and families

Course aim

The aim of this training is to help professionals identify and support children, young people and adults around domestic abuse. The course will cover domestic abuse: peer on peer, intimate relationships, siblings, and adolescents to parent violence. The course will look at theories to underpin working with children and young people and resources to help professionals with their conversations around domestic abuse. It will also look at support available for victims, young people using harm to others and perpetrators.

Session 1: Will consider the prevalence of Domestic Abuse ‘the whole family approach’, attitudes, trauma informed practice, and attachment theory

Session 2: Will consider the coordinated response, theory in practice, reflections, tools and resources.
