



Working Together to Safeguard Children

1 Day Face to Face Training

In response to living with Covid and participant feedback, the SSCP are moving towards a hybrid model of training delivery providing both online and face to face Working Together to Safeguarding Children to meet learners needs and in line with the professional's role and contact with children, young people and families.

Who should attend?

This face-to-face training will deliver key safeguarding messages all professionals essentially need and is aimed at those who come into contact and work with children, young people, and families as part of their role and in the course of their work.

Course aims:

- To consider the current context of Working Together to Safeguard Children
- To understand that each agency shares a common goal, and to reflect on your own responsibility
- To increase knowledge and understanding of legislation, policy, and procedure of safeguarding children
- To understand the importance of recording information, and how to make a referral
- To understand the impact of working with trauma on practitioners and the importance of self care

Content:

- Module 1 – What is safeguarding?
- Module 2 – What is abuse?
- Module 3 – Impact of abuse
- Module 4 – Multi-agency working & safeguarding

It is recommended that following the Working Together training, those professionals who require a greater depth of safeguarding knowledge must also attend the Multi-Agency Guest Speaker training and any other additional relevant training.
