Complex Safeguarding: Basic Awareness of Child & Adolescent Exploitation

This course will increase participants awareness and understanding of Complex Safeguarding and enable you to recognise indicators of exploitation (through sexual or criminal nature) and the associated risk factors and will enable you to make an appropriate referral to the correct agencies

Who should attend?

The course is aimed at anyone who may come into contact with children and young people in Salford, such as professionals from health, children's social care, housing, hospital staff, police, schools and education (FE/HE), sports and leisure staff, faith and community groups, youth workers and volunteers.

Aims of the course

- Develop understanding of the definitions of complex safeguarding and contextual safeguarding
- Identify children and young people who may be at risk

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- Develop understanding of the vulnerabilities that lead to child exploitation
- Provide an overview of Child Sexual Exploitation, Criminal Exploitation & Modern Slavery including Cuckooing and County Lines
- Develop recognition of typical indicators of exploitation in children and young people
- Develop understand how, when, and why to share information and make a referral
- Develop recognition of push and pull factors
- Develop awareness of what to do and where to get help if you are worried about child exploitation
