Recognising and Responding to Neglect: Improving outcomes for children in Salford

What is the event about?

The experience of neglect during childhood can have significant, long-lasting and pervasive consequences, affecting all aspects of a child's development and their lives into adulthood. It is the most common type of abuse experienced by children and is increasing in Salford, as nationally.

Neglect has been a longstanding priority for the Safeguarding Children's Partnership in Salford. We know we need to do more so that children have their needs met by their parents or carers, and support is provided where this is not the case. We want to ensure that we identify and prevent unmet needs from escalating so that all children in Salford have the childhood they have a right to. We want all families and children within them to thrive and we speak for the whole partnership when we ask everyone in Salford to support our campaign to increase the number of thriving families and reduce neglect.

The event will include a range of guest speakers from across the partnership.
