### Salford Sexual Health Training

#### **Purpose of the training**

In response to rising teenage pregnancies and sexual transmitted infections this training seeks to empower non-healthcare and healthcare professionals with the confidence to initiate sensitive, inclusive and factual conversations about sexual health, and to signpost and support people to access local sexual health services.

#### **By the end of the training, participants will be able to:**

- Understand the importance and characteristics of a trauma responsive, sex positive and inclusive approach to sexual health.
- Feel confident to talk about a range of contraceptive methods with young people and signpost them to appropriate services.
- Tell young people about the most common STIs, their symptoms, testing and treatment, signpost to services, and counter common myths and challenge STI stigma.
- Explain the benefits of condoms, tell young people about condom distribution schemes and carry out a condom demonstration.
- Recognise important safeguarding issues related to young people's sexual health and wellbeing and be able to take a multiagency approach to keeping young people safe.
