Introduction

Programme Challenger is Greater Manchester's response to Serious Organised Crime. The Modern Slavery Organised Immigration Crime Unit (MSOICU) are a specialist team dedicated to the disruption of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking (MSHT) crimes.

Training Objectives:

- Understanding what the modern slavery is
- Basic understanding of the National Referral Mechanism and support available for the victims
- Understanding the scale of the modern slavery and its presence within the local authority
- Basic knowledge on indicators and how to spot modern slavery
- Basic understanding of key legislation
- Basic understanding of responsibilities of local authorities in responding to modern slavery

- Understanding the importance of trauma informed approach
- Understanding the importance of intelligence sharing for the purpose of safeguarding or serious crime prevention
- Knowledge on how to raise concerns when coming across potential cases of modern slavery

Following the course participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate basic awareness and understanding of modern slavery
- Know the indicators of modern slavery and be able to explain how to respond to concerns and where to access advice
- Become confident in sharing intelligence

The training will conclude with a 30 minute Q & A session, providing delegates with the opportunity to ask questions and engage in discussion related to the topic and their own professional practice.
