Complex Safeguarding: Understanding and Responding to Child Exploitation



This course is run over **two sessions** and will cover key areas on understanding and responding to child exploitation including Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE), Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE) and modern slavery. Attendees will also receive a basic understanding the impact of trauma and the use of language to enable them to work more effectively with children and young people.

Aims of the course

- An overview of Child Sexual Exploitation, Child Criminal Exploitation and Modern Slavery
- Contextual safeguarding, interfamilial harm and impact on vulnerability to exploitation
- Adolescent development and exploitation
- · Basic understanding of trauma and its impact
- Push and pull factors
- · Diversity and exploitation
- Exploitation: Context & Language
- Transitions
- What to do if you are worried

Who should attend?

The course is aimed at anyone working directly with children and young people who are at risk of, or have experienced exploitation in Salford, such as professionals from children's social care, health housing, hospital staff, police, schools and education (FE/HE), sports and leisure staff, faith and community groups, youth workers and Voluntary Sector.

This course is split into 2 sessions, only apply for a place if you are available to attend both.
