Multi-Agency Neurodiversity Training

Around 15-20% of all the people living in the world are thought to have a neuro-difference. No two people will be affected in the same way. Neurodiversity is an umbrella term used to describe the different thinking styles that affect how people communicate with the world around them. It can be used to sum up lots of different things and can include conditions like autism, ADHD, dyslexia, dyspraxia, dyscalculia and tourette's.

The following key areas will be explored:

- What do we mean by neurodiversity, how does it affect brains and what is the impact for people?
- Challenge around anti discriminatory practice - we need to adapt not them. Get people thinking.
