## **Purposes**

We process your personal information for the following purposes:

- To safeguard and promote the welfare of children and to protect them from harm
- To identify new safeguarding issues and emerging threats;
- To conduct rapid reviews of cases, local and national child safeguarding practice reviews, and any other reviews to aid local learning and improvement in safeguarding services;
- To conduct multi-agency audits and support regulatory inspection of services;
- To monitor the quality and effectiveness of the service

## **Categories of personal data**

In order to carry out these purposes process the following categories of personal data:

- Name, address and contact details
- Sex, gender and sexual orientation
- Race, ethnicity and language
- Images and video
- Unique identifiers, such as National Insurance Number
- Health and social care data
- Employment and education data
- Financial data
- Criminal conviction data and Police intelligence

## Legal basis for processing

The legal basis under **Article 6** of the UK GDPR for processing your personal information is: (c) **Legal Obligation**: processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the controller is subject in accordance with the following:

- Children Act 1989 and 2004
- Children and Social Work Act 2017

The legal basis under **Article 9** of the UK GDPR for processing special category data is: (b) **Social security and social protection law**: Processing is necessary for the purposes of carrying out the obligations and exercising specific rights of the controller or of the data subject in the field of employment and social security and social protection law

**Article 10** of the UK GDPR states that processing of personal data relating to criminal convictions and offences or related security measures based on Article 6 shall be carried out only under the control of official authority or when the processing is authorised by Union or Member State law providing for appropriate safeguards for the rights and freedoms of data subjects.
