Introduction to Managing Allegations with LADO

This training is for everyone working or volunteering with children.

What is LADO?

LADO stands for Local Authority Designated Officer. They are responsible for managing and overseeing allegations made against adults who work with children — ensuring concerns are taken seriously, investigated fairly, and managed safely.

LADO training is all about helping you understand what to do if a concern or allegation is made about an adult working with children. Whether you're a social worker, volunteer, coach, youth leader, or part of a community group, it is important to know how to respond in a way that keeps children safe and supported.

This session will guide you through the steps to take, share the legislation and key policies that support the process and explain the role of LADO. We aim to give you the confidence to act if something doesn't seem right.

LADO training helps you:

- ✓ Understand your safeguarding responsibilities
- ✓ Recognise when an allegation or concern needs to be referred
- ✓ Learn how the LADO process works
- ✓ Protect children and young people from harm
- ✓ Know how to respond professionally and confidently

CHARGING POLICY
