Salford Sexual Health Training

Purpose of the training

The teenage pregnancy and sexual transmitted infection rates in Salford are higher than the national figure. Young people still report they do not receive the information they need from PSHE.

This training seeks to empower you if you are a non-healthcare or general healthcare professional, to have the confidence to initiate sensitive, inclusive and factual conversations about sexual health, and to signpost and support people to access local sexual health services.

The training is aimed at those working with vulnerable young people. The information and messages work for adults too

By the end of the training, participants will be able to:

- Understand the importance and characteristics of a trauma responsive, sex positive and inclusive approach to sexual health.
- Feel confident to talk about a range of contraceptive methods with young people and signpost them to appropriate services.
- Tell young people about the most common STIs, their symptoms, testing and treatment, signpost to services, and counter common myths and challenge STI stigma.
- Explain the benefits of condoms, tell young people about condom distribution schemes and carry out a condom demonstration.
- Recognise important safeguarding issues related to young people's sexual health and wellbeing and be able to take a multiagency approach to keeping young people safe.

CHARGING POLICY

From 1st April 2023 the SSCP has re-introduced the non-attendance charging policy.
