



Family Partnership Model

This course will provide participants who have not had the two day training with a basic understanding of the Family Partnership practice model that is being rolled out across Salford Children's Social care. Our Early Help colleagues have been using this practice model for some years, and we chose to adopt the same model to ensure consistency across Salford.

Family Partnership Model is an 'Asset' based model which takes a trauma informed approach through partnership, and shared understanding of the family strengths with the child/ren at the centre. The overall aim is to empower and encourage autonomy through better problem-solving abilities to ensure sustained long- term outcomes for children.



Family Partnership Model Framework

Who should attend?

The course is aimed at anyone who may come into contact with children and young people in Salford, such as professionals from health, housing, hospital staff, police, schools, and education (FE/HE), sports and leisure staff, faith and community groups, youth workers and volunteers. This is aimed at professionals who have not had the 2 day training -it is a short course to introduce the model to all multi agency colleagues.

Aims of the course

- Provide an overview of the Family Partnership Model.
- Develop an understanding of how the Family Partnership Model supports professional curiosity and trauma informed practice.
- Share how the Family partnership Model actively promotes the voice of Children & Families to evidence impact and effectiveness.
- Share how the model encourages practitioners to work in a strength-based way with families both in written and direct face to face interventions.
- To strengthen relationships with key partners and promote shared responsibility to support the families to be the best they can.

CHARGING POLICY

From 1st April 2023 the SSCP has re-introduced the non-attendance charging policy. Agencies will be charged if staff fail to attend if we are not informed of cancellation at least 5 working days before the session. This includes participants who arrive late and are not admitted by the trainers as they have missed a section of the course or participants who on the day inform the trainers they need to leave early. The charge will be £50.
