# Complex Safeguarding: Understanding and Responding to Child Exploitation



This course is run over **two sessions** and will cover key areas on understanding and responding to child exploitation including Child Sexual Exploitation (CSE), Child Criminal Exploitation (CCE) and modern slavery. Attendees will also receive a basic understanding the impact of trauma and the use of language to enable them to work more effectively with children and young people.

- An overview of Child Sexual Exploitation, Criminal Exploitation & Modern Slavery including County Lines & Cuckooing
- Push and Pull Factors
- Diversity & Exploitation
- Exclusion to exploitation what can we do to support and engage young people?
- What happens when a young person turns 18?
- Exploitation: Context & Language
- What to do if you are worried

### Who should attend?

The course is aimed at anyone working directly with older children and young people who are at risk of, or have experienced exploitation in Salford, such as professionals from health, children's social care, housing, hospital staff, police, schools and education (FE/HE), sports and leisure staff, faith and community groups, youth workers and volunteers.
