



Working Together:

Multi-agency Guest Speaker Level 3 Training

It is recommended that those professionals who require a greater depth of safeguarding knowledge also attend the **Multi-Agency Guest Speaker 1 & Guest Speaker 2** training following the Working Together training to further enhance their knowledge.

Delegates will hear from Early Help, Police, Paediatricians and Legal reps about the agency's role in safeguarding children and young people. Delegates will have the opportunity to interact with speakers and will develop a greater understanding of the response to child safeguarding concerns from the statutory agencies.

The Guest Speaker sessions are split into two sessions and will be run over 2 days – delegates must complete both Guest Speaker 1 & Guest Speaker 2 sessions to successfully complete the enhanced training.'

Who should attend?

The Multi-Agency Guest Speaker 1 and Guest Speaker 2 course is open to all delegates that have completed the new Working Together to Safeguarding Children training and who work with and come into regular contact with children, young people and families.

If you have completed the SSCP Foundation training pre February 2020, the new guest speaker sessions are a repeat of the guest speaker slots from the Foundation course, therefore you do not need to attend this training, unless you wish to refresh your knowledge.

Course aims:

- To develop an awareness and an understanding of the statutory services and their role in safeguarding children and young people
- To increase knowledge and understanding of agencies processes, and key legislation and procedures in safeguarding children
