Summary



- The theme of this Listening Hub meeting was to hold a practitioners forum to explore the role of co-production in local safeguarding work.
- The Listening Hub usually meets every 8 weeks to share engagement work and discuss themes from children, young people, and families. This session aimed to **expand the group's scope** and consider how it could become a space that champions co-production.

Key themes



1. The Growing Importance of Co-Production

- There's increasing **local and national focus** on co-production, especially with changes in the new *Working Together* guidance.
- There is a regional project supporting North West Safeguarding Partnerships to increase
 participation with children and families. Members from Salford <u>Parents 4 Positive Change</u>
 participated in number of conferences as "experts by experience," reinforcing Salford's
 strong involvement.

2. Openness, Inclusion, and Awareness

- Several attendees emphasized the need to open up the Listening Hub to wider participation.
 - Currently, it has operated as a "closed membership" group.
 - There's a call for promoting it wider as a go-to space to hear about what's happening across Salford.

3. Clarifying Co-Production vs Consultation

- There was a discussion on the need to clearly distinguish between:
 - Consultation (seeking feedback)
 - o **Co-design** (developing ideas with people)
 - Co-production (sharing power and decision-making)
- A shared resource (e.g. **flowchart or guide**) was proposed to help services understand when and how to use each approach.

4. Using Real-Life Examples

- The "softer" impacts such of collaborative work such as building friendships and networks often **go unrecorded** but are **highly valuable** and could encourage more participation if shared more widely.
- Idea: collect and share case studies showing real impact of co-production on young people and families.

Next Steps and Future Opportunities

Listening Hub to **raise awareness** of definitions related co-production that includes terminology and frameworks.

Listening Hub to explore co-producing a **practical guide or resource** about engagement approaches.

Listening Hub to be promoted as an open, collaborative space for all practitioners across Salford.

Key Reflections

Practitioners attending the forum are **aligned in their understanding** of what co-production is and why it matters.

There's strong enthusiasm to **move from discussion to practical tools**, shared learning, and real engagement.

The Listening Hub committed to ensuring Salford remains a **regional leader** in coproduction.
